ABOUT THE ARK OF THE COVENANT?

The Ark of the Covenant is more than just a feature in the *Indiana Jones* movies!

The Ark of the Covenant was the sacred chest, carried by the Israelites through their forty year travels in the desert towards the promised land. The Ark was built according to very specific instructions given by God to Moses, and inside it were contained the stone tablets on which the Ten Commandments were inscribed, a jar containing some of the manna with which God had fed the Israelites in the desert, and the staff of Aaron by which God had worked miracles in Moses' arguments with Pharaoh.

The Ark of the Covenant was considered the holy place of God's dwelling among the people of Israel. During their travels in the desert it was carried with them and housed in a special tent whenever they made camp. Eventually it would be housed in the Temple built by King Solomon, in the part of the Temple called the Holy of Holies.

One of the names sometimes given to Mary is "Ark of the New Covenant". This is because she physically carried inside her the perfect and definitive presence of God among his people: Jesus the Word made flesh. The Ark of the Old Testament is what we call a "type" of the new and perfect Ark: it foreshadowed and contained a veiled image of what was to be fully realised in Jesus.

Parish Administration Officer

and is calling for applications.

The role is part-time (20 hours a week) and provides assistance to the Parish Priest in the administrative tasks of the parish.

Principal duties include:

- Providing general secretarial/administrative assistance to the Parish Priest
- Produce the weekly parish bulletin
- Maintain administrative documentation and filing systems
- Print liturgical texts and other requirements for liturgies
- Maintain rosters for Sunday Mass
- Monitor and order stock for office & church
- Maintain copyright log for hymns each week
- Maintain parish sacrament registers
- Prepare paperwork and make appointments for baptisms, marriages, and funerals
- Other general reception duties as required.

The position involves sharing of some duties with another staff member.
